## **DEPRAVDA EDITOR GRACE FULLER MYSTERIOUSLY AND UNEXPECTEDLY SUDDENLY DISAPPEARS ABRUPTLY WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE LEAVING NO DISCERNABLE TRACE!!!**



Grace Fuller, Washington socialite and editor of the Depravda newsletter, has been neither seen nor heard from since the October issue went to press in early November.

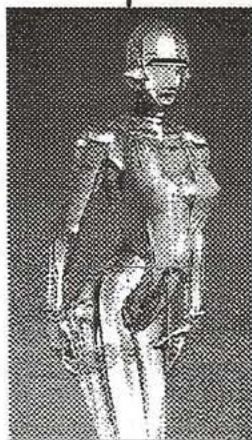
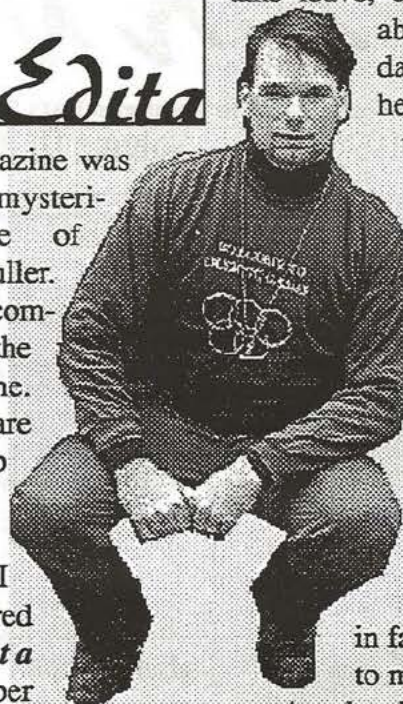

Sure, why not.

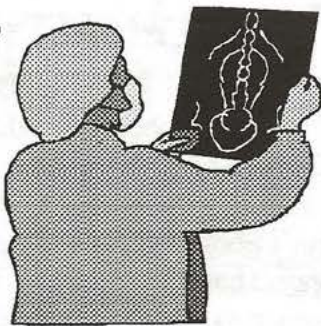
