#19 Paul Styrene looked for chalk Xs on Post vending machines throughout the metropolitan area.

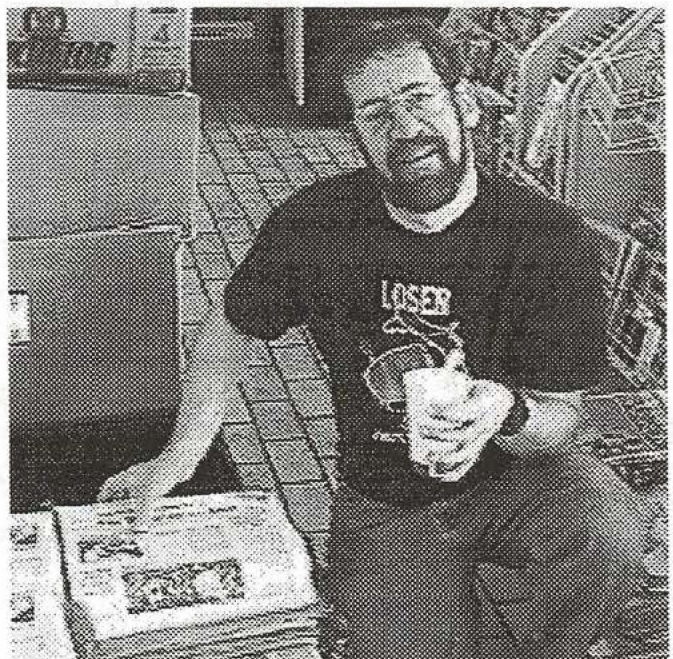
#20 Robin Grove looked for chalk Xs on Most ATM machines throughout the metropolitan area.

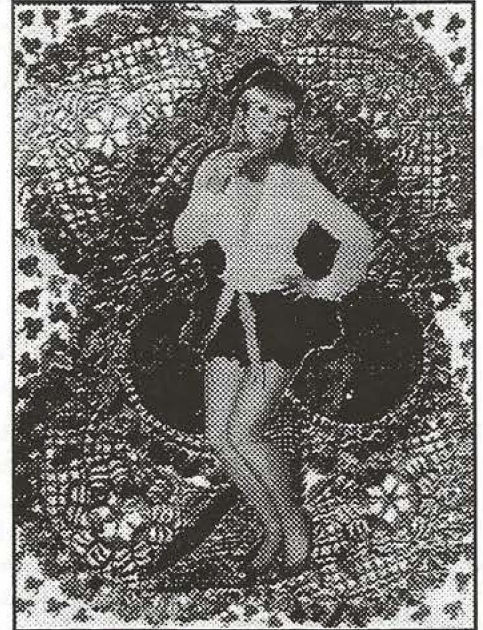

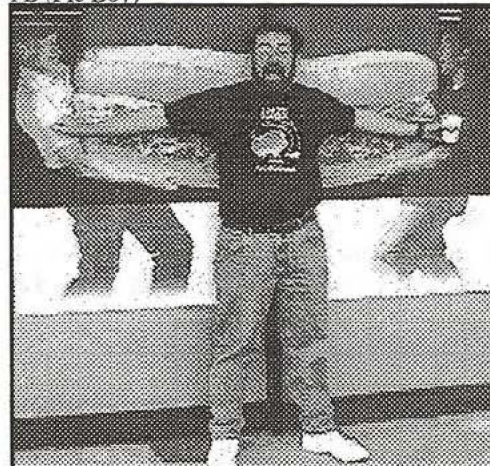

Sarah Worcester and her sister, Kate Koutsavlis (who has also appeared in the Style Invitational) have written, produced, directed, and starred in 6 films to date.

Q: How did you get started in film?

A: 'Dances with Whales' was our first film. We were looking for something to do while on vacation at the beach. It was a remarkable achievement for novices -- we didn't think we would be able to edit so we shot the entire film in sequence with only one take per scene. It turned out well, considering. Later on we actually learned to use the equipment.

Q: But you got better, didn't you?

A: I think so. We spent close to a year planning our second film, the action-adventure blockbuster 'Double Extremities.' It had costumes and location shots and choreography. Shooting, editing, and dubbing consumed almost all of our two-week stay at the beach. I'm still amazed that we were able to get footage of the nuclear power plant without being stopped, but got thrown out of the trailer park for unauthorized filming.

Q: Are your co-stars always inflatable beach toys?

A: Generally, yes. Although the inflatables' roles were limited in our third film, the French surrealistic classic 'Le Diner Le Diner Le Diner,' they are a major presence in our other works. Especially gators. Gators are very versatile because you can put clothes on them easily and they have hands. One of our gators, Leland, has even appeared in the Style Invitational in the "Whatever happened to Week 64?" competition. Leland was mentioned in connection with an unfortunate incident at Bob's Goat World. The Czar called it "bizarre and frankly insane."

Q: So while you and your sister and the gators are on camera, who is behind the camera?

A: My father, Dale Worcester, was our cameraman for the first 3 films. He managed to sucker my brother-in-law, John Koutsavlis, into taking over starting with our fourth film, 'The Beach Party Murders.' It's a tough thing to do well but they've both done a great job. They've also been obliging when we needed them in front of the camera. John played a Heroic Agent of the United States Secret Service in one scene of 'Double Extremities II: Attack on Plum Island' (our fifth film) and many Losers will remember seeing my father play a saloon patron in our latest film, 'Gatorado.'

Q: Why don't your films get a broader distribution?

A: We don't have permission to use copyrighted works that we have incorporated into the films, i.e., the music. Most of our movies have copyrighted sound recordings dubbed over various scenes. In 'Gatorado' all the music was very obligingly provided by Tom Witte (to whom we are eternally grateful) but even that was predominantly copyrighted arrangements. Anything other than showing the movie to our friends and guests would be an infringement of the copyright. This is an example of how copyright law can be used to prevent making too much of an ass of yourself in public.

Q: When did you first meet Dave Zarrow, and do you share any unusual skills?

A: Almost 23 years ago. We can both read stenotype.
