



# STYLE INVITATIONAL SHUTS DOWN

IT'S THE END OF THE WORLD AS WE KNOW IT - AND I FEEL FINE







It's been just over five years since the Style Invitational contest closed its doors for the last time. This month we're taking a look back at the original Depravda headline of the time and what happened in the wake of that monumental event. What became of the people who once reigned atop the list of Losers and what happened to the institution formerly known as the Washington Post.

The Washington Post - It was a cold day in hell when the Washington Post announced that the Style Invitational would be put on a "hiatus" while the Czar was temporarily reassigned to some mysterious project. Although the paper promised the contest would return in January of the following year they never made good on that promise. A year later when the Post was lost in a hostile takeover by Rupert Murdock a high ranking managing editor at the Post (who wished to remain anonymous) would be heard to say that cancelling the contest was the largest single business mistake they had ever made. Strangely, Charlottesville resident and trip organizer Brian Broadus was not fazed by the travel time. 
