

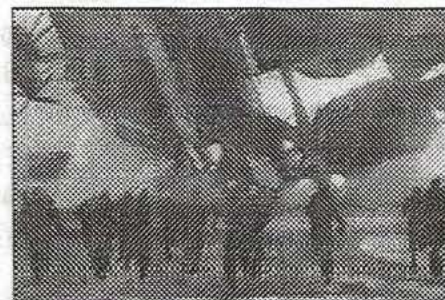
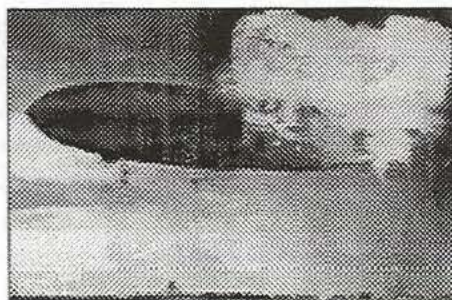

STYLE INVITATIONAL SHUTS DOWN IT'S THE END OF THE WORLD AS WE KNOW IT - AND I FEEL FINE



It's been just over five years since the Style Invitational contest closed its doors for the last time. This month we're taking a look back at the original Depravda headline of the time and what happened in the wake of that monumental event. What became of the people who once reigned atop the list of Losers and what happened to the institution formerly known as the Washington Post.

The Washington Post - It was a cold day in hell when the Washington Post announced that the Style Invitational would be put on a "hiatus" while the Czar was temporarily reassigned to some mysterious project. Although the paper promised the contest would return in January of the following year they never made good on that promise. A year later when the Post was lost in a hostile takeover by Rupert Murdoch a high ranking managing editor at the Post (who wished to remain anonymous) would be heard to say that cancelling the contest was the largest single business mistake they had ever made. Now printing in tabloid format, The New Wash Post frequently features front page photos of congressmen taking swings at staff photographers.

Chuck Smith - Chuck reigned forever as the Biggest Loser of all Time, a title which ironically prevented him from further advancement in his cushy government job. His acting career almost took off however when the WB series *Buffy the Vampire Slayer* doubled the demand for extras as corpses. Jessica Mathews - Founded a new weekly humor column that has something to do with funny numerical equations. As far as we can tell, absolutely no one understands it.

Ken Krattenmaker - Remains in seclusion

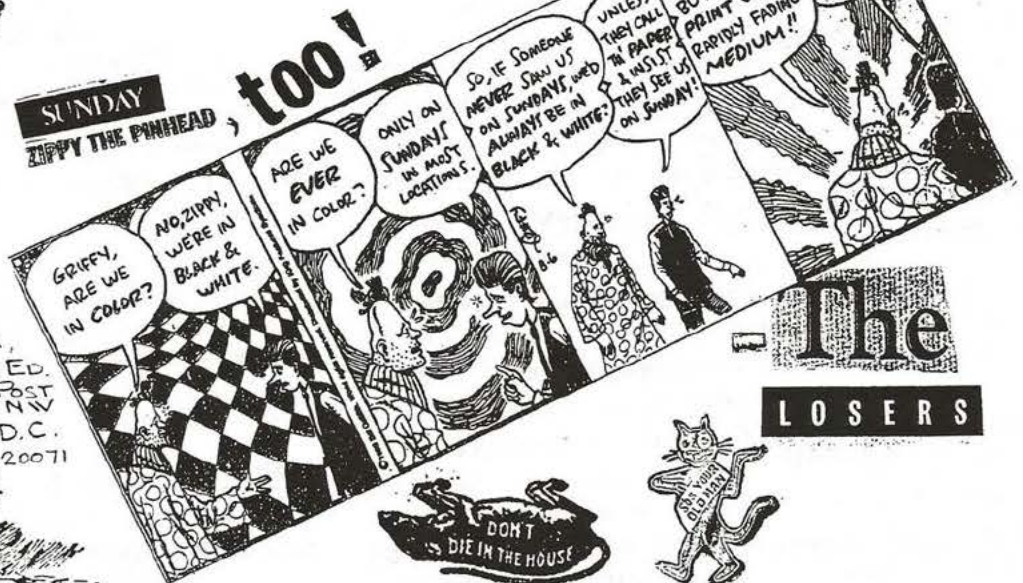

LOSERFEST 99 (tm), possibly the first and last trademarked Loserfest, was a joint production of the team of Brian Broadus and Peyton "Limerick Joe" Coyner. The festivities took place in Charlottesville VA on the weekend of July 10-11, 1999. The drive down was fairly long for most Losers, averaging three hours. Strangely, Charlottesville resident and trip organizer Brian Broadus was not fazed by the travel time. The scenic byways of rural Virginny intoxicated Losers as they dodged speed traps and them dern revenueurs to get to the first Loserfest activity, tubing on the James River.
